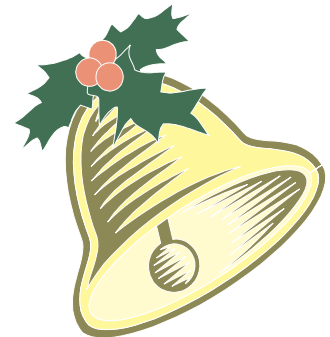


# THE CARAVANER

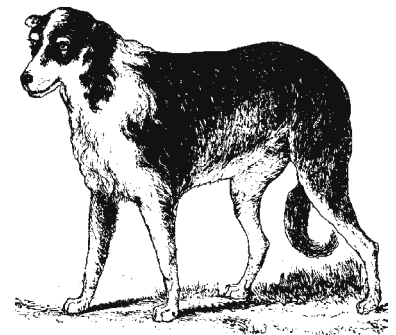

2nd Jack Walker & Maria Johnson

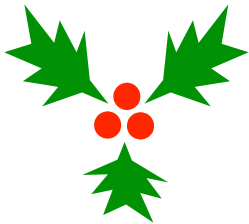
We had 32 people sign up for our Washer toss tournament held on Saturday morning. However, we only had 12 women so four of the men were paired up with other men.
