Dan Duran our Fire Extinguisher Technician will return to Live Oak again on Saturday, May 21, 2016 for the purpose of recharging and sale of new extinguishers.

He sells the Amerex 3A 40BC Dry Chemical Fire Extinguisher. Dan Duran recommends that our motorhome extinguishers be recharged every year since they travel in our RV's and the powder packs down with constant road movement. Please note: Your motorhome may have come with a small extinguisher with a plastic head. These small extinguishers are not rechargeable and their ability to put out a fire is limited.

NEW EXTINGUISHER \$55.00

Saturday, after morning announcements bring your extinguishers to the pay table near the Host Tent. Make certain your name and rig # is on your extinguisher. A Sharpie permanent marker will be available, if needed. BE SAFE AND RECHARGE.
