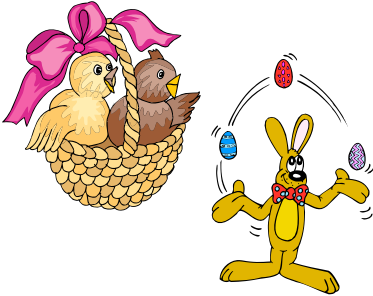


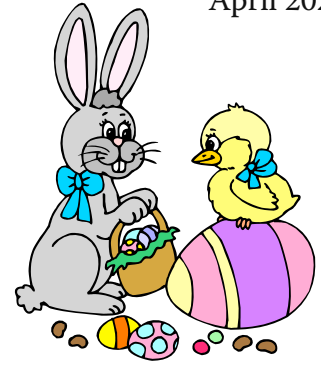

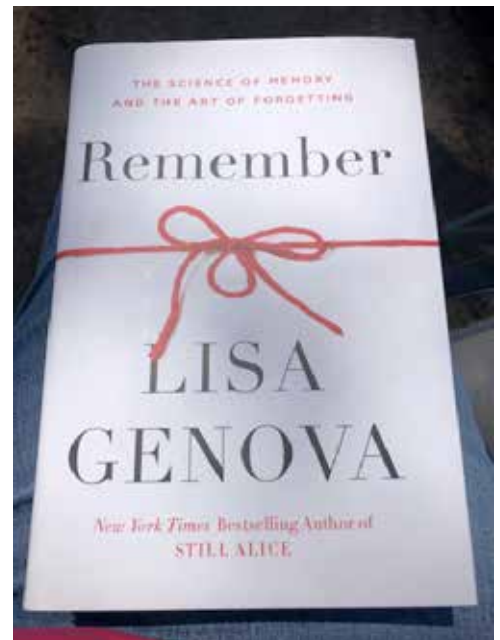
WOMEN ONLY

Out and About in the Hemet Area

While there are many club-hosted activities planned during each caravan, sometimes it's nice to get out and explore the surroundings.

This month's caravan at Tualota Springs RV park is located in an area that has several options to satisfy your wanderlust. Here is a short list of places in and around Hemet you may wish to explore, visit or shop:

1) Wildflower Trail by Diamond Valley Lake - This 2.1-mile easy hiking loop takes about an hour to complete and gives a scenic view of . Our caravan coincides with what is considered the most ideal time to take in this easy hike as it is usually in bloom March through June. There is an \$11 fee to park the car at the trailhead and \$4 per person is collected as you enter the marina parking area. 2) Speaking of Diamond Valley Lake, this body of water is one of the largest man-made reservoirs in Southern California. It boasts some great black bass fishing as well as the home of bluegill, sunfish, rainbow trout and catfish. Boat and pontoon rentals are available at the marina, 2615 Angler Ave., Hemet, CA. 3) If you'd like an outdoor hike a little more strenuous than the wildflower loop, you may want to check out the moderately challenging .6 mile loop to the nearby stone maze, which features petroglyphs that are estimated to be 2,000 years old. 4) If you travel a little farther out, you'll find the Sugarplum Zoo & Chocolate Shop at 36965 Berenda Rd. in Temecula. Owner Lani Rager, made it to the semi-finals in the Master Chef competition because of the chocolate culinary skills she brought with her from New York. An animal lover, she and her husband, Greg, started a small, special needs therapy zoo that has grown into a petting zoo on an 8-acre hilltop ranch. It is open to the public daily from 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Reservations are not required. For more information, visit: <https://www.sugarplumzoo.com/>.

5) If wine-ing, dining and shopping are more your thing, Temecula has become a popular destination as Southern California's wine country. See a list of wineries and restaurants at: <https://www.visitemeculavalley.com/>

6) And if there aren't enough shops in the Temecula wine country to satisfy your need for retail therapy, you can score some sweet deals at the Outlets at Cabazon open from 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. at 48750 Seminole Drive in Cabazon.
